A GAME 7 THRILLER FOR THE NBA TITLE

The Sacramento Kings' lone franchise NBA World Championship came in 1951 when the then-Rochester Royals defeated the New York Knickerbockers in seven games. Following is the game story and box score of the Royals' thrilling 79-75 Game 7 victory over the Knickerbockers as it appeared in the New York Times.

ROCHESTER, N.Y., April 21 — Proving once again that free throws are more important than field goals, the Rochester Royals won the National Basketball Association championship before 4,200 spectators at the arena tonight by beating the New York Knickerbockers, 79 to 75, in the seventh game of the final play-off series. The Royals had won the first three games, the Knicks the next three.

Just how completely dependent Rochester's victory was on its foul line steadiness is clear in the chronology and statistics of the game. Bob Davies broke a 75-all tie with forty-four seconds to play when he sank two free throws after being fouled by Dick McGuire while driving to the basket; and in all, the Royals made twenty-nine out of thirty-seven free-throw attempts while New York sank only seventeen out of twenty-five. The Knicks had four more baskets, twenty-nine to twenty-five.

The fouls brought about New York's defeat in another way, too. Both its centers, Nat Clifton and Connie Simmons, fouled out in the last quarter, when the Knicks took the lead for the first time after trailing by as much as fourteen points in the first half. Meanwhile Arnie Risen, Rochester's center who took top-scoring honors with 24 points and scored the deciding basket before Davies made his free throws, committed his fourth foul twenty-two minutes before the game ended and played unpenalized the rest of the way.

Clifton, Simmons Foul Out

With Clifton and Simmons out, the Knicks were unable to control the jump balls that followed each foul in the last three minutes, so that their doom was really sealed when Risen made his last basket. New York was ahead, 74 to 72, when Simmons fouled out with two minutes left. Risen made the toss, then jumped against Ernie Vandeweghe and, when Rochester got possession, Arnie's hook shot put the Royals ahead, 75 to 74. Boryla tied it up a moment later but Rochester then froze the ball until Davies drove in.

Before the final minutes, the Knickerbockers' made another of their typical comebacks that marked their play all season long. The most "overtime" club in the league, they qualified for the final by coming from behind in their final game against Syracuse, and, after losing the first three to Rochester, trailed in each of the three games they won.

Tonight, trying to perform the ultimate in comebacks, they started by falling behind, 13 to 3. By the end of the first quarter they were up to 22 to 16, but a few minutes later Rochester led, 32 to 18. The Knicks battled back to within four points but trailed, 40 to 36, at halftime.

Knicks Finally Take Lead

In the third quarter they climbed to within three, then two, and were behind, 62 to 60, entering the last quarter. They finally achieved a 69-all tie midway through the period and took the lead for the first time, 71 to 70, with four minutes to go. Both times Gallatin converted under-the-basket feeds from McGuire.

McGuire added a foul half a minute later and the teams alternated free throws until Simmons fouled out against Risen. Rochester's final basket, with two seconds left, was a lay-up by Coleman after a successful freeze had settled matters.

Lou Eisenstein and Stan Stutz, the officials, charged the Knicks with thirty-two personals and the Royals with twenty-two. Splitting each team's total evenly between the two halves. Very few fouls were called against Rochester, however, in the play under the boards, where the Royals emerged with a 48-to-41 edge in rebounds. Clifton's fifth personal was particularly unfortunate for the Knicks, since it came while Rochester was holding the ball at mid-court. He was called for bumping Risen while moving into position. A minute and a half later he fouled out.

Coaches Voice No Complaints

No complaints were voiced about the officials, however, either by Knick coach, Joe Lapchick, or Rochester coach, Les Harrison, who, after Rochester's loss in New York Wednesday, found Eisenstein unsatisfactory and asked that he be replaced for tonight's game.

By their victory, the Royals earned \$7,500 to add to their previous winnings and wound up with \$13,250 in play-off money to divide up. The Knicks finished with \$2,500 less and the satisfaction-disappointment of one of basketball's greatest near-misses.
